President Melissa Horan opened the meeting Wednesday, October 4th at 7:02 p.m. at the Front Street Civic Center, 2205 Front Street, Melbourne, FL 32901.

Secretary, Mary Kinberg – September minutes were printed in the Moonstone. Melissa asked if there were any changes to the minutes. As there were no changes, the minutes were approved as printed in the Moonstone.

Bill Haar did a presentation on how he makes ear wires. He uses 21gauge Argenteum wire. Bill uses a specific piece of wood to measure the size of the wire, he also uses a double flush cut clipper, that cuts the wire flush on both ends. He then uses a Cupper, also known as a wire rounder. It removes the sharp edge of the cylinder. Next, he uses the Ear Wire Crimper and then puts the ear wire between two pieces of magic plastic and hits the magic plastic with a hammer. He saves money by making his own ear wires and it's easy to do. Thanks Bill for showing us the tools that you use and explaining the purposes. Lots of great information!

Kim Kisselstein – Treasurer- Kim began using the credit card square and said it was used a lot at the Legacy Sale. The Legacy Sale brought in over \$5047. Thanks everyone!! Great job on the Legacy Sale!

Vice– President, Lynn McKinney- We have two speakers lined up; Bill Haar will be doing a presentation on opals and Lynn will be doing a presentation in a few months.

Education Chair, Dave Wayment –Discussion on keeping the workshop clean. Jim Ragan reminded members that if they are working at the workshop, they need to clean up after themselves, including taking trash out when they finish.



RAISING A CABOCHON

When a cabochon sits too low in a bezel, the bezel can hide a lot of the stone. The solution is to either sand down the bezel height or boost up the stone. But if you choose to to raise it up, the question is what is the best material to use ?

I was taught to use fine sawdust but now think that might be a problem when used in rings. I reason that rings will frequently get wet, which would cause the sawdust to swell in size and push the stone against the bezel. Then when the sawdust dries out, the stone would be a little loose.

In any case, I now prefer to insert a flat sheet to boost up my stones. It can be a scrap of metal or some plastic from product packaging or old credit cards. In either case, just cut a piece to loosely fit into the bezel and drop in the stone (with some dental floss) to check it's height.
